- Articles: 6,000 10,000 words, including footnotes
- Short submissions (e.g. book review or topical opinion piece): 1,000 3,000 words

We invite you to submit an abstract of the manuscript (300 words) to info@marsafelawjournal.org. Please include the following information: author name(s) and affiliation(s), the type of manuscript, title and the projected word count. The abstract should also clearly indicate the timeliness of the topic and its suitability for the Journal. Please consult www.marsafelawjournal.org/authors/authors-guidelines for more information.

Papers submitted for publication must be original, neither published nor under consideration for publication. The Journal has a high standard of scientific quality and each manuscript is subject to an internal peer review by the Editorial Board, followed by an external, double-blind peer review by a scholar in the relevant academic field.
